MAY DAY FETE MONDAY 7TH MAY 1.30PM

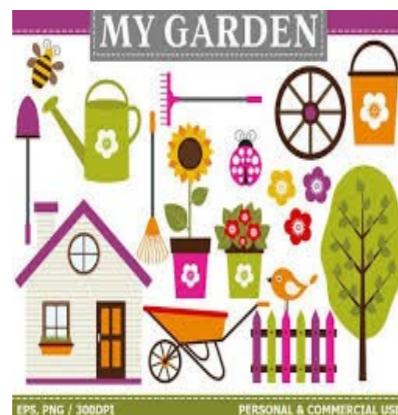

NEW ROAD JUNCTION ON POPE LANE

There were objections from local residents, Hutton Parish Council, the Lancashire Branch of the Campaign for Rural England, South Ribble Ward Councillors and the Borough Council Planning Committee. Despite this a representative of the Secretary of State visited the location as a result of an appeal by planning consultants Cassidy and Ashton on behalf of the applicants; Messrs TJ Haley and MR Bailey to create a new private road and junction on to Pope Lane. The road and junction will create another entrance into the Meadowcroft site from Pope Lane through the Woodland fronting the site. As a result of this visit the SRBC Planning Committee decision was overturned and at the time of writing this article, the road and junction are under construction.



PUBLIC ACCESS DEFIBRILLATOR (PAD)

How to use a defibrillator (British Heart Foundation)

If you come across someone who is not breathing or breathing erratically, the most important thing is to call 999 and start CPR to keep the blood flowing around the body. After a cardiac arrest, every minute without CPR and defibrillation reduce of survival by 10%.

If you are on your own don't interrupt the CPR to go and get a defibrillator. If it is possible, send someone else to find the defibrillator.
