POLICE AND COMMUNITIES TOGETHER AND LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL <u>Important Information</u>— Beware of Cold callers/ salesmen knocking on your door. Trading Standards advice is:

- 1. **Never** agree to have any work done as a result of a cold call. **Do not** make snap decisions and do not be pressurised in to having the job done.
- 2. If you think work needs doing to your home, get quotes from two or three traders. Ask friends and relatives to recommend a reputable business.
- 3 Ask for the full name and address from a trader **<u>before</u>** considering dealing with them. Never rely solely on a mobile phone number.
- 4. Ask for a written quotation detailing all the proposed work and a final price for the job.
- 5. Only pay once the work is completed to your satisfaction. Do not pay cash. Do not pay money up front for traders materials.
- 6. Check the identity of all callers to your home. Ask for photo identification, even if the caller claims to be from a utility company, the police or local authority. Check it carefully with the telephone number in the phone book, **not** the number on the ID.

The improvements to the hall are gradually taking place, the new central heating boilers are now fully operational, the new LED lights have been installed and the other electrical work, including hand driers in the toilets, new sockets and provision for an overhead projector are taking place and hopefully by the time you read this will have been completed. The re-decoration began on Tuesday 30th May. The work is taking longer than we first envisaged due to trying to keep disruption to bookings down to a minimum and making sure we have the right contractors.

The May Day Fête took place this year on Monday 1st May. We attracted lots of visitors from near and far who supported the many stalls, games, attractions, hot dogs, re-freshment, cakes etc., resulting in an income for the hall of just over £4,000.00. Hutton Parish Council Chairman's Report May 2017

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our clerk, Bill Whittle for providing advice and support and ensuring that our Council has run effectively during the past year. Thank you also to each and every Councillor for representing Hutton at many and varied meetings and also for promoting and looking after the Parish's best interests. Thanks to Vivien Hastewell for producing Hutton News and to those residents who distribute the Newsletter four times a year whatever the weather. Finally, I would like to say a big thank you to Peter Heist, our Lengthsman for all his good work during the last year.

The Council agreed that the precept for the Council Tax year of 2017-2018 should be frozen at twenty two thousand pounds, the same as the last tax year.

Over 100 residents attended an extra ordinary Parish Council meeting on Monday 1st February 2016 in Hutton Village Hall. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss a planning application for 46 dwellings on land opposite Hutton Grammar School. After listening to the concerns raised by residents which were overwhelmingly against the development due to concerns over flooding and road safety the Council voted to object to the planning application. Despite this local opposition to the development the SRBC Planning Committee at its meeting on Wednesday 20th April 2016 voted to approve the application.

The Lancashire Best Kept Village plaque awarded to Hutton in 2015 is now displayed on a purpose built stand adjacent to the tourist board at the end of Styles Avenue.

Since taking ownership of **Long Wood** in 2016 the Council has planted a Living Christmas Tree at the Liverpool Road end of the Wood. This will do away with the cost of purchasing a new tree each Christmas. The existing electricity supply has been moved from its original location to the site of the new tree. In our determination to care for Long Wood and ensure its regeneration, one new Oak Tree and one new Hornbeam tree have been planted replacing two Oak Trees which had blown down during storms.

A Memorial Service was held on Friday 11th November. This was the fourth service at the Hutton War Memorial and was well supported by residents, Hutton Parish Councillors. South Ribble Councillors and our Member of Parliament, Mrs. Seema Kennedy. The service was conducted by the Rev. Andrew Parkinson from St. Andrew's Church, Longton. The Head Teacher of Hutton Grammar School also attended the service with a number of teachers and students representing the school. A student from HGS played the Last Post and Reveille.

The third Hutton family Christmas party was held on Friday 9th December 2016 in Hutton Village Hall. Local organisations made and sold gifts and the children from Hutton Playgroup entertained those present by singing Christmas Carols. Father Christmas interrupted his busy schedule to give out gifts to the children whilst the adults enjoyed a free glass of mulled wine and mince pies.

Visitors to Hutton Playing Field will have noticed that the 19 bay car park extension which was started in December 2016 is almost ready for use. The construction work has been completed and the grass seed was sown in March 2017. When the grass has become established the car park will be opened for use.

As a result of a tree blowing down from neighbouring woodland during storm Doris on to the Hutton Parish Council owned bus shelter in Pope Lane at its junction with Lindle Lane. A new shelter was installed at the end of April 2017.

2017 brings the start of a new and exciting project for Hutton Parish Council. We are creating a wildlife area at the end of the playing field adjacent to Longton Brook. This wildlife area will utilise the 150 tons of earth excavated to create the car park extension. The two mounds which have been created will be prepared over the summer months and sown with a variety of wildflower seed. The two scrapes will contain water in the winter and dry out in the summer and will be planted with bog species and semi aquatic plants. This semi aquatic feature will be surrounded by mixed grassland, woodland and thicket to create a variety of habitats for many living creatures. Although the creation of this Wildlife area should be completed by the end of 2017, the area will continue to develop itself over the coming years, increasing the diversity of wild-life expected to inhabit it.

Further measures are being planned to encourage car drivers to use the car park. Following the two fatalities in separate accidents in the PR4 4BA area of Pope Lane, this area is now included in the South Ribble Borough Council rota for placement of SPID devices. In addition Lancashire Constabulary have placed signs advising drivers that they are monitoring speeding on this section of road.
