May Day Fete

The first fete was in 1981 and was not on May Day but was in July for the people of Hutton to celebrate the wedding of Prince Charles and Lady Diana Spencer. The family event has been a May Day Fete since 1982 and is still enjoyed by families from Hutton and surrounding areas.

Preston to Liverpool by stagecoach

In 1774 the first regular stage coach service began running through Hutton connecting Preston and Liverpool. By 1800, there were 4 coaches per day.

The main occupations were: Agriculture and weaving in homes.

Hutton

The name Hutton is derived from old English: "Hoh-Tun". It is transcribed as being a "Settlement on a spur of Land".

There is good reason to believe that there was a settlement in Hutton five thousand years ago.

It was after the Norman Conquest before any significant record has been found. There was no mention of Hutton in the Domesday survey of 1086 AD.

The first real record of Hutton began about 1150 AD with a landowner – Orme De Hutton recorded as owning a large portion of the estates of Hutton.

Hutton had strong connections with Cockersands Abbey and the Abbey was given a large area of Hutton by grateful landowners.



Hutton Parish Council Chairman's Report May 2019

I would like to take the opportunity to thank our clerk Bill Whittle for providing advice and support and for ensuring that our Council has run effectively during the past year. Thank you too to each and every councilor for representing Hutton at many and varied meetings and also for promoting and looking after the Parish's best interests. Thanks to Vivien Hastewell for producing Hutton News, to Raj for his design work and to those residents who distribute the Newsletter four times each year whatever the weather. Finally I would like to thank Peter Heise, our Lengthsman, for all his good work during the past year. The Council agreed that the precept for the Council Tax Year 2019-2020 should be frozen at £22,000.00 which is the same amount as last year.

Public Access Defibrillator (PAD)

A Defibrillator has been purchased and attached to the outside wall of Hutton Village Hall. The purchase was made possible with donations from the LCC Parish Champion, Rotary Club of Preston South, Hutton Village Hall Committee and Hutton Parish Council.

Centenary of the end of WW1

A commemorative bench was purchased by three Hutton residents who have only recently moved in to the Parish.

Benches

Hutton Parish Council has taken ownership of all benches in the Parish (some of the benches were previously owned by SRBC). New benches have now been purchased and placed in Long Wood, Stiles Avenue, Ratten Lane and Pope Lane.

Planters

Following discussion with the owners of the row of shops in the Village centre, I am pleased to report that planters containing shrubs and flowers are now located on the apron in front of the shops. I am sure these

will provide additional colour to the area.

Memorial Service

A Memorial Service was held on Sunday 11th November 2018. This was the 6th Service to be held at Hutton War Memorial and was particularly poignant as it was the 100th anniversary of the end of WW1. This year's service was conducted by Rev. Andrew Parkinson from St. Andrew's Church in Longton and Fr. Michael Barrett from St. Oswald's Church, Longton. The service was attended by over 100 residents with councilors from Hutton and SRBC. Coffee and soft drinks were served in the Village Hall where our Member of Parliament Seema Kennedy cut a specially created celebration cake which was enjoyed by all.

The fifth Hutton Family Christmas Party

This was held on Friday 7th December 2018. Local organizations made and sold gifts. Children from Hutton Playgroup entertained those present by singing Christmas Carols. Father Christmas interrupted his busy schedule to give out gifts to the children whilst adults enjoyed a free glass of mulled wine and mince pies.

Lengthsman

An assistant Lengthsman commenced work with Hutton Parish Council on 1st April 2019. He is employed for eight hours per week on a flexible service contract until 30th September 2019, assisting Peter, our Lengthsman, in keeping Hutton an attractive place to live. It is with mixed feelings that I write this report as my tenure as a Hutton Parish Councilor came to an end on 2nd May 2019. However I have every confidence that the Council will continue to ensure that the Parish of Hutton is the best place to live.

We also utilise a lengthsman who assists in keeping the village clean and tidy.

There are, like with most organisations, rules and regulations to be followed however training is available so that Councillors can become familiar with the way councils work.

- Putting forward ideas for better services in the area
- Responding to the needs and views of their constituents
- Acting within the law
- Seeking the best outcomes to local issues
- Accepting the corporate view of the Council
